Transportation and logistics law

What liability can you claim from your logistics partners? How do you know that they have the right insurance coverage? How are shipments from Asia insured?

We specifically look at those risks that are associated with logistics transactions and answer the following central questions: How are agreements regarding logistics assignments structured? What should we specifically keep in mind when drawing up an agreement? Which of the parties in a logistics chain has liability for the goods?

Transportation and logistics law

A large part of the course is dedicated to the importance of drawing up a good agreement. By foreseeing things in the agreement you can avoid various risks. The more knowledge you have about the rules of the game in the market, the larger the possibility to prevent common problems and disputes.

(Transport and logistics law is included in the certification program in logistics, CLSilf®, but is also given as an independent course.)
